WHAT'S ON & WHO'S HERE

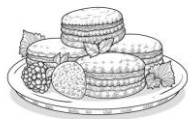

OMEO & DISTRICT SHOW'S CHARITY WOOL BALE

\$137,445 RAISED IN 11 YEARS

The Omeo & District Agricultural & Pastoral Society established the Charity Wool Bale for the Latrobe Valley Base Helimed 1 Auxiliary in 2015.

Thanks to many woolgrowers from all over Gippsland who enter fleeces in the Omeo & District Show's Fleece Pavilion and then donate them to the Omeo Show Charity Wool Bale. These donated fleeces may be judged, are then baled, transported to the Melbourne Wool Selling Centre by Grinters Transport, then auctioned early in the following year. Support is also provided by Elders, the Stratford Lions Club, the Meerlieu & District Community Group and generous wool buyers.

All funds are donated to Latrobe Valley Base Helimed 1 Auxiliary who support Ambulance Victoria's air wing fleet of rotary and fixed wing aircraft. HEMS fleet are based around Victoria with HEMS2 based in the Latrobe Valley. The air wing provides emergency and routine responses across Victoria including our local region.

RULES & REGULATIONS

All rules and regulations are listed at the back of this Schedule. The rules are for our volunteer Judges, Stewards and entrants to follow to make sure everyone gets a uniform & fair go. Omeo & District Agricultural & Pastoral Society Inc (ODAPS) has its local rules and these dovetail with the Victorian Agricultural Shows (VAS) rules which take precedence for VAS events/classes. There are some that apply to all events/classes and others which are added for particular sections of events/classes. Make sure your entries will comply. We reckon it's pretty much common-sense.

PRIZE & EXHIBIT COLLECTION

If there is a prize card beside your exhibit, you may have won some money. Speak to the Pavilion Manager or a Steward on Showday who will help you tear-off the side card. Present the side card at the Secretary's Office on Show day to collect your prize money. Prize money can only be collected on Show day by the winner. Leave your exhibit in place until 4pm on Show day. Leave any trophy, sash or ribbon in place also until after 4pm.

VAS - VICTORIAN AGRICULTURAL SHOWS

Omeo & District Agricultural & Pastoral Society Inc (ODAPS) is the legal entity running the Omeo & District Show. ODAPS is affiliated with Victorian Agricultural Shows Ltd (VAS) who offer support, governance, advocacy and State wide competitions.

19 VAS Competitions are offered here at the Omeo & District Show. Win a VAS event here and progress to regional judging at the Gippsland Area Show Association (GASA) final held the following May. Win at regional level and progress to the State final judged at the Melbourne Royal Show &/or State VAS Convention.



In 2025, local youth Arle Kewish was awarded a second place for her Photograph at the regional judging event. In 2024, Omeo's own Grace Fitzgerald placed first in the State 2024 VAS Carrot Cake Final. Luke Bowd placed second in the State Junior Carrot & Date Muffins also in 2024.

CLASS 60 VAS LTD CARROT CAKE

Class 60 VAS Ltd Carrot Cake



Ingredients - preferably 100% Australian grown produce

375g plain flour

2tsp baking powder

1 ½ tsp bicarb soda

2tsp ground cinnamon

½ tsp ground nutmeg

½ tsp allspice

Pinch of salt

345g castor sugar

350ml vegetable oil

4 eggs

3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams)

220g tin crushed pineapple, drained

180g pecan nuts coarsely crushed

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
3. Bake for approximately 90 - 100 minutes
4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

CLASS 61 VAS LTD RICH FRUIT CAKE



Class 61

VAS Ltd Rich Fruit Cake

Ingredients - preferably 100% Australian grown produce

250g sultanas	1/2 tsp ground ginger
250g chopped raisins	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250g currants	250g butter
125g chopped mixed peel	250g soft brown sugar
90g chopped red glace cherries	1/2 teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind
90g chopped blanched almonds	1/2 teaspoon almond essence
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
250g plain flour	4 large eggs
60g self-raising flour	
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg	

Method

1. Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.
2. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
3. Sift together the flours and spices.
4. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
5. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
6. Place the mixture into a prepared 20cm square tin, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

CLASS 62 VAS LTD JUNIOR CARROT & SULTANA MUFFINS

Ingredients - preferably 100% Australian grown produce

2 ½ cups self-raising flour	1 tbsp orange marmalade
1 tsp ground cinnamon	1 cup canola oil
1/4 tsp ground nutmeg	2 eggs, lightly beaten
1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)	¾ cup orange juice
1/3 cup chopped in 1/2 sultanas	1 cup reduced fat milk
1 cup coarsely grated carrot	



Method

1. Preheat oven to 190C (moderately hot)
2. Line a 12 hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases - Classic white muffin cases size (30mm-40mm Height x 70mm-80mm Wide x 45mm-50mm Base)
3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl, stir in sultanas and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer, if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.
7. Show Entries: Four (4) muffins per paper plate.

CLASS 63 VAS LTD JUNIOR BOILED FRUIT CAKE

Ingredients - Preferably 100% Australian Grown Produce

375 grams of mixed fruit	1/2 cup of sherry
3/4 cup of brown sugar	2 eggs slightly beaten
1 teaspoon of mixed spice	2 tablespoons of marmalade
1/2 cup of water	1 cup of self-raising flour
125 grams of butter	1 cup of plain flour
1/2 teaspoon of bicarbonate of soda	1/4 teaspoon of salt

Method:

1. Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well. TIP: Do not overmix the mixture.
3. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.
4. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

ODAPS – RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Entries must be made with the relevant Entry Secretary, Event Steward or Online by dates shown in the schedule.
2. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor at any time of entry.
3. No exhibit of any description will be allowed to compete in more than one class of the Society's Prize List, except for special prizes, or where otherwise specified in Prize List.
4. All exhibits must be delivered at the show grounds in accordance with times listed for each event.
5. Exhibitors must, when making entries, comply strictly with directions on forms.
6. The Society invites the exhibition of exhibits other than those enumerated in the Prize List.
7. No exhibit shall be removed from the show grounds until 4.00pm on the day of the show except livestock which may be removed after the award of relevant prizes.
8. Exhibits not picked up on Show day can be claimed Sunday 9-10am at the Pavilion.
9. Judges commence duties on Friday from 5pm for Main Pavilion exhibits. Only officials can remain in the Pavilion at this time.
10. The Judges have the power to withhold any prize if they deem the exhibit is not worthy, or give a lesser prize, or they may award special prizes in the form of a certificate for the exhibits which they deem worthy and not included in the foregoing prize list.
11. No Judge shall be an exhibitor in the department where he/she is officiating.
12. No person who is an Exhibitor interested in an exhibit (except those actually in charge of stock) will be allowed to remain in the judging ring, either before or during adjudication of exhibits under the penalty of disqualification.
13. Should any exhibit having gained a prize be disqualified, the next on the list shall not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Committee, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the matter. Donations to the prize fund, whether general or special, when not awarded shall revert to the Society. Prize money not collected on the day will revert to the society.
14. All prize money is to be collected on show day.
15. Protests, with \$50.00 deposit, which shall be forfeited if the protest be deemed frivolous, must be lodged with the Secretary before 4pm on the day of the show.
16. Proved wilful misrepresentation of exhibits will not merely cause a prize to be forfeited but render the exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future shows of the society. The onus of proof of bona fides of exhibits and compliance with conditions, to rest upon the exhibitor, who, if deemed necessary, may be required to make a statutory declaration in respect of same.

17. Owners entering livestock do so entirely at their own risk and it is a condition of entry, in any event, that no liability of any kind attaches to the Society, the Committee, Officers and Members in any respect whatsoever.
18. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit & it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the society blameless & indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident.
19. The Society will not in any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of any exhibits at the Society's exhibition or any damage thereto.
20. The Society does not hold itself responsible for any errors that may occur in the schedule and entries are accepted on these conditions.

VAS - RULES & REGULATIONS – APPLICABLE TO ALL VAS EVENTS & CLASSES

21. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
22. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final.
23. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group level and one Group at State level. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
24. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
25. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
26. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show/field day.
27. An exhibit may only win one Group Final in a show season (Spring to Autumn), should the same article be entered again and found to have already won a Group Final in the same show season the exhibitor must forfeit/refund any and all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.
28. Late entries not accepted.
29. Junior entrants must be under 18 years of age on the day of their local show.
30. Professionals are not eligible, which is defined as someone that works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that craft, art form or technique.
31. An exhibitor having won at their local Show will bake another cookery item for the following Group Final then the winner of the Group Final will bake another item for the State Final at the following VAS Convention or Royal Melbourne Show for Open categories and at the Annual VAS Ltd Convention for the junior categories.
32. An exhibitor having won at Show level is not eligible to enter any other Show until after the Group Final judging.

33. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.
34. The entrant must follow the recipe and specifications provided below.
35. If an exhibitor is found to have won more than one Group Final the exhibitor must forfeit/refund all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.

ADDITIONAL ODAPS - PHOTOGRAPHY RULES

36. All VAS photographs must either be mounted or ready for hanging.
37. All VAS photographs must have the owners name marked on the entry in such a position that it will not be visible when displayed.
38. Any name or signature on the front of an exhibit must be concealed.
39. All reasonable care will be taken by judges, stewards & ODAPS in the handling and displaying of entries, and they will not be held responsible for any damage.

ADDITIONAL VAS - PHOTOGRAPHY RULES

40. Unframed.
41. Print no larger than 8" X 12" or 20cm by 30cm.
42. Must be mounted on thick card (mount no larger than 3cm)
43. All regulations on this page are to be used in conjunction with the ODAPS Rules & Regulations printed in this schedule.

ODAPS & VAS – DOG HIGH JUMP COMPETITION REGULATIONS

44. This competition is a test of the dog's jumping ability.
45. The competition is open to all dogs of all shapes and sizes.
46. The dog is permitted to jump on to or over the jump.
47. A dog who has placed 1st or 2nd at a Local Show/Field Day Level will qualify for the State Final.
48. A dog can represent only one Local Show/Field Day.
49. All dogs not competing must be on a lead with a handler in the marshalling area behind the competition area.
50. Competition area should be 15 metres long by 8 metres wide.
51. Only one dog may be loose in the competition area at any one time.
52. There must be a handler at the top of the jump to act as a catcher if necessary, and a handler as a catcher at the bottom.
53. The dog's owner must supply one extra handler.
54. A ladder will be provided for the handler.
55. Each dog is allowed three attempts at each height.
56. In the event of two dogs jumping the same height, the winner shall be determined as the dog that took the least number of attempts for the winning height.
57. A dog may compete on a loose lead.
58. If the dog is not on a loose lead the dog must be released at a minimum of three metres from the jump.
59. Any mishandling or misuse of a dog will incur immediate disqualification.

60. If, in the opinion of the stewards, a dog is unsafe to other competitors or the public, it will be withdrawn from the competition.

ODAPS - HORSE SECTION - RULES & REGULATIONS

61. All riders & competitors must wear an approved safety helmet whilst mounted.
62. All horses must remain in the designated horse area and never enter other parts of the Show grounds.
63. All horses and ponies in the Show Grounds must be in hand or tied up where directed in the stalls or areas provided.
64. Every rider must complete a Waiver before entering any class.
65. No one can enter the arena/oval until they have completed a Waiver. Waivers can be found on Showday Online and in the Secretary's Office.
66. A warm up ring provided on the arena.
67. Competitors and all those near horses are warned that horses are prone to be unpredictable. Care should be taken when riding near other horses or when on the ground near horses.
68. Report any dangerous incident or activity to the Secretary's Office.
69. If a rider falls off, he/she will not be allowed to remount until checked by medical personnel.
70. The signing of the waiver shall be taken as a guarantee that any animal is free from disease as far as is known to the owner. In case of infectious disease being spread through or by an exhibitor, the exhibitor shall be held responsible for any loss or damage caused.
71. Please remove your horse's dung from a camp site before leaving.
72. Exhibitors declare that exhibits in the Horse Sections are the property of the Exhibitor and are entered subject to the Rules, Regulations and Conditions of the Society.
73. The Breeding year dates from the 1st of August each year.
74. Proof of ownership of stallions 3 years old & upwards must be produced at time of entry.
75. Where height is stipulated, all Ponies, Galloways or Horses must be measured by the Official Measurer who will be in attendance from 8am on day of show. The height certificate must be produced to the stewards when entering the ring for judging (1/2 inch shall be allowed for shoes).
76. Stallions are only eligible to compete in their own classes except jumping events.
77. In all cases where age of riders is mentioned, it is compulsory that an age certificate or proof of age may be requested and upon demand to be shown to stewards. If a certificate cannot be produced, the competitor may be automatically disqualified and barred from that event. The Certificate can be in the form of a birth certificate, extract of birth, statutory declaration, baptism certificate or school certificate.
78. Any exhibitor who supplies the wrong information on entry forms will render themselves liable to disqualification.
79. Exhibitors must present tickets to stewards upon entering the ring for judging.

80. Led stallion events, stallions must have bridle bit within mouth at all times of exhibiting.
81. Local District Classes, Rider and Horse must have resided within the post codes between 3893 – 3900 for the 6 months prior to the show.
82. Junior riders, from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 years, competitors may, if the organizers so stipulate, compete in all age categories for which they are eligible.
83. Novice event entrants must not have won 1st place at an agricultural show in order to compete in that event.
84. Any horse winning a Champion is ineligible to compete in the same class in other Rings. Novice and Intermediate winners are not eligible to compete for Champion or Reserve Champion.

VAS - OFF THE TRACK - RULES

85. Open to any thoroughbred horse bred to race that has been stud book registered, either domestically with the Australian Stud Book or Internationally. Registrations will be checked.
86. Riders to be 12 years and over on day of the qualifying show.
87. Colts/Stallions are not permitted to contest a series qualifier.
88. Qualifying classes will be judged ridden.

VAS - GOOD HANDS - RULES

89. The VAS Good Hands Challenge Trophy is open to boys and girls aged 10 years and under 15 years on the day of the Local Show.
90. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability - mount, saddlery or costume will not be taken into account.
91. Special attention will be paid to hands & seat, general management & control of the horse or pony.
92. Competitors must ride using an ordinary snaffle, single jointed in the centre. The mouthpiece must be smooth and made of the same type of metal, with or without a cavesson on the noseband. A gear check may take place. Please note straight bar snaffle, drop nosebands, whips and spurs are not allowed

HORSE STEWARDS

93. All stewards please note that Stewards should be in place half an hour prior to judging to get exhibits ready for the judge and meet exhibitors. Then at least 10 minutes prior to judging, one Steward should call at Secretary's Office and collect books, ribbons and prize cards and meet the Judge. All Stewards are to pay attention to broadcast announcements and are requested to keep announcer up to speed with current events within the ring.
